## 1. Individual Assignments and Quizzes



#### Individual assignments

- Online questions and exercises extremely similar to quizzes
- Mandatory to answer <u>before</u> the beginning of the class on which the quiz will take place
- If you don't answer the assignment, your maximum grade on the quiz will be 4.0.- The maximum grade will vary proportional to the completion of the assignment (ie. 50% completion implies max grade of 5.5)

## 1. Group Assignments



#### ► Group Assignments

- Groups to be formed on March 21st
- Group size will depend on class size. Ideally 4 groups
- 1 group leader
- Deliverables: 3 Videos
  - 2 lectures based on a chapter of BMA
  - 1 case resolution
  - PPT, drawings, narrator, animation, etc.
  - Length 15 30 minutes
- Group grade to be distributed among members by group leader
  - No member of the team can have the same grade as other, unless group grade is 7.0 (In this case, it isn't mandatory for all members to receive a 7.0. Disciplinary actions are allowed and encouraged)
  - In case of disagreement, secret vote among members to resolve
  - Final appeal and resolution by Professor
  - If team appeals, the team must later split

## 1. Group Assignments



#### **Example 1**

- 5 member group
- Group grade 6.0, resulting in 30 points to distribute
  - Member 1: 6.2
  - Member 2: 6.0
  - Member 3: 5.8
  - Member 4: 5.5
  - Member 5: 6.5

#### Example 2

- 4 member group
- Group grade 7.0, resulting in 28 points to distribute
  - Member 1: 7.0
  - Member 2: 7.0
  - Member 3: 7.0
  - Member 4: 4.0 (disciplinary action)

## 1. Class and class participation



#### ▶ The class will split 75% discussion / analysis and 25% content review.

- This implies only 20 minutes of regular lecture at the beginning of the class. The remaining time will be dedicated to problem solving, applications, discussions, case resolution, video presentations, etc.
- It's essential you STUDY (as opposed to read) the class materials BEFORE attending the session

#### Class participation is graded

#### Examples:

## 1. Class Attendance



#### **▶**Class attendance
